Authors Series

Chuck Walley will give a brief reading of his newly released book, "Incidental Contact," on Saturday, October 16, from 12 noon to 2:30 p.m. The reading will be followed by questions and answers. He will discuss the general theme of the book, the creative process, and anything else that may be of interest. Paperback and hard cover editions will be available for book signing. The book is currently among the top sellers of the publisher, AuthorHouse. Refreshments will be served.

#Reading and Discussion Series

"Reading Between the Lines--Rethinking Religion: Recent Women's Novels and American Identity," a thematic discussion series will be held in four sessions through the fall and early winter of 2010. A preliminary meeting (optional for participants) will be held September 7, at 7 p.m. to determine the dates of four sessions. Discussion leader is Paula Roy, writer, educator and school consultant. Each session will focus on a book related to the series theme, "Rethinking Religion." The books for the series are: Paradise Park, A Novel, by Allegra Goodman; Ceremony by Leslie Marmon Silko; Paradise by Toni Morrison; and Final Payments: A Novel, by Mary Gordon. The Discussion Series is free and open to the public and is funded by the New York Council for the Humanities. Pre-registration is required by calling the library at 369-6008.

Art Exhibit September & October

The Utica Art Association's Fall Exhibit will be on view in the Old Forge Library wing from September 11 to



Fifteen plus members of the Utica Arts Association will exhibit their work from Saturday, September 11th through October 30th. An opening reception will be held in honor of the artists as part of the First Friday Art Walk on October 1st from 5:00 PM-8:00 PM. Watercolor "Moment of Seclusion" by member Peter Rashford will be on display.

October 30. The Opening Reception for the exhibit is Friday, October 1, from 5-8 p.m. It is free and open to the public. The exhibit will feature 15 artists that include the following artists: Martha Deming, a watercolor and pastel artist and retired art educator, whose favorite subjects are landscapes, flowers, and the horses and other animals on the 140 acres surrounding her home and studio in Remsen; Peter Rashford who works in pen and ink, acrylics, watercolor, pastel, charcoal, colored inks and pencils to create realistic landscapes, wildlife, fantasy and a dab of abstract; and Suzanne Costanza, who creates collages with mixed media that includes handmade papers, pieces of glass, beads, yarn and anything that relates to the colors and themes within the picture. She is also president of the Utica Art Association. Deming, Rashford and Costanza will be joined by twelve other artists who will also add their work to the Fall Exhibit at the library.
