Events, Programs, Series and Workshops

► **Tech Services & More Computers available:** During July, August and September, the Library will temporarily double the number of computers available to the public thanks to Mid York Library System Satellite PCC Program. The library will add five up-to-date laptops for community use, a schedule of computer classes and a sign-up sheet for individual computer tutoring. Trained staff members from the MYLS BTOP technology department will be available to teach classes and offer individual assistance on Tuesdays and Thursdays at our library until the end of September.

The Upper Hudson Valley Watercolor Society "Summer Exhibit" will be on display in the Judith Lowenstein Cohen Memorial Wing at the Library from July 3 – July 31. There will be an Opening Exhibit Reception on Friday July 6 from 5 - 8 p.m. The Upper Hudson Valley Watercolor Society, based in Glens Falls, New York, is dedicated to encouraging both emerging and experienced artists working in water media by providing a venue for workshops, networking and fellowship.

"A Textural World" Art Exhibit showcasing the work of artist Philippa Shrader will be on display in the Judith Lowenstein Cohen Memorial Wing at the Library from August 1 - September 1. Bill Smith, popular Adirondack storyteller and balladeer returns to the Old Forge Library on Tuesday July 3 at 7:30 p.m. along with fiddler Don Woodcock. Smith, the popular storyteller, delights audiences everywhere. As the youngest of ten children, he learned stories of woodsmen and the woods from his logger father and songs and poems from his mother. At the age of 14, Don Woodcock began playing the fiddle. More than 40 years later, Don holds the title of Grand Champion

Fiddler of New York State. He is widely recognized for having one of the greatest repertoires of traditional fiddle tunes anywhere.

***Adirondack Civilian Conservation Camps**

On Tuesday July 10 at 7:30 p.m. author Marty Podskoch will give a presentation on his newest book chronicling the history of Civilian Conservation Camps in the Adirondacks. Over the last 6 years Podskoch has met with CCC alumni, their families, and friends who shared their stories and pictures. There were 26 camps in the Adirondacks, including one in Thendara and in Boonville. Books will be available for purchase and author signing.

***Summer Writers Workshops**

This year's workshops will feature a four-session Adult Workshop and a four-session Tweens & Teen Workshop on Wednesdays July 11 - August 1. The Tweens & Teen Workshops will meet from 3-5 p.m. The Adult Sessions will be held from 6:30-8:30 p.m. The director of both workshops will be Mary Sanders Shartle, poet and author, who has taught numerous writing workshops for adults, senior citizens and for children and teens. She recently finished her novel "THE HERMIT: The Truth and Legend of Lily Martindale" about a woman living alone in the Adirondacks. There is no fee for the workshops, but enrollment is limited.
